

## **EVENT REGULATIONS**

### **D-DAY HEL 2026**

dated 21 May 2026

#### Section 1

1.1 The following definitions shall apply in these Regulations:

- a) Event – shall mean the gathering of collectors of historical vehicles used on the Western Front during World War II, reenactors and historical reenactment groups, combined with battle reenactments, taking place from August 16 to August 23, 2026, within the area of the City of Hel.
- b) Organizer – shall mean the Foundation for the Preservation of Military Technical Heritage, with its registered office in Bielsko-Biała, ul. Pasterska 18, 43-310 Bielsko-Biała, entered into the National Court Register under KRS number 0000320197, NIP 9372584893, REGON 241086414, represented by its President Rafał Aleksander Bier.
- c) Organizer's Representative – shall mean a person holding an appropriate Identification Badge, authorized to make decisions on behalf of the Organizer regarding the organization of the Event.
- d) Person Responsible for Pyrotechnic Effects – shall mean a person appointed by the Organizer to supervise the preparation, placement, and use of pyrotechnic materials during the Show and authorized to issue instructions concerning their safe execution.
- e) Organizer's Services – shall mean:
  - 1) security personnel – persons holding appropriate authorizations, responsible for ensuring safety and maintaining order,
  - 2) event staff – persons authorized by the Organizer, including volunteers, responsible for informational, organizational, and auxiliary activities within the scope specified by the Organizer.
- f) Participant – shall mean a person entered on the list of Participants prepared by the Organizer, authorized by the Organizer to remain within the Event Area to the extent and under the conditions specified in the Regulations and Organizer's announcements, identified on the basis of an Identification Badge or another document issued by the Organizer, excluding Visitors (the audience).
- g) Reenactor – shall mean a Participant entered on the list of reenactors prepared by the Organizer, who may be authorized to participate in the Show and other elements of the Event program related to historical reenactment, under the rules

specified by the Organizer, and wearing either a military uniform or civilian clothing stylized to the World War II period.

- h) Visitor (Audience) – shall mean a person authorized to remain within the Audience Zone of the Event Area, who is not a Participant, under the conditions specified in these Regulations.
- i) Historical Vehicle – shall mean a vehicle used during World War II, participating in the execution of the Event, which is not a modern machine.
- j) Event Area – shall mean locations within the area of the City of Hel designated by the Organizer, including the Audience Zone, Special Zones, and other areas related to the organization of the Event, marked in the field or in organizational announcements.
- k) Identification Badge – shall mean a personal or function-assigned designation issued by the Organizer, specifying the scope of authorization of its holder to remain within designated zones of the Event Area and to perform specified functions during the Event, in accordance with the Organizer’s decision and under the rules specified in the Regulations.
- l) Audience Zone – shall mean a publicly accessible area located within the Event Area designated for Visitors, enabling observation of the Event.
- m) Special Zones – shall mean designated and appropriately marked areas of the Event Area accessible exclusively to persons holding an appropriate Identification Badge, including in particular the pyrotechnic zone, historical reenactment zone, technical zone, media zone, guest zone, and other zones designated by the Organizer. Special Zones may be subject to additional regulations specified in detailed regulations, instructions, rules, or announcements issued by the Organizer, provided they do not conflict with these Regulations. Detailed rules governing individual Special Zones shall be specified by the Organizer in separate organizational documents.
- n) Show – shall mean a presentation, stage, or reenactment undertaking carried out within a Special Zone designated by the Organizer in the Event Area as part of “D-Day Hel 2026”. Historical vehicles, blank-firing weapons, and pyrotechnic devices may be used during the Show. Provisions concerning the Show shall constitute special provisions in relation to the remaining provisions of these Regulations.
- o) Show Area – shall mean a Special Zone designated by the Organizer within the Event Area, closed to Visitors (the audience), in which the Show is carried out.

## Section 2

- 2.1 These regulations, hereinafter referred to as the “Regulations,” define the rules for participation in the “D-Day Hel 2026” Event, as well as the rights and obligations of persons participating in the Event and of the Organizer. Participation in the Event shall constitute acceptance of the Regulations in their currently binding version.
- 2.2 The Regulations shall apply to all persons present within the Event Area during the duration of the Event.
- 2.3 The binding version of the Regulations shall be the version published at the location where information about the Event is made available. Every person present within the Event Area is obliged to familiarize themselves with the current version of the Regulations before participating in the Event.
- 2.4 The Organizer may issue guidelines, instructions, procedures, and announcements concerning the organization and safety of the Event. Such documents shall supplement the Regulations and shall be binding upon all persons present within the Event Area, provided they do not conflict with the Regulations or applicable law.
- 2.5 The documents referred to in Clause 2.4 may concern in particular:
  - a) rules for participation in the Show and other high-risk activities;
  - b) organization of the Event Area and its division into zones;
  - c) safety rules;
  - d) rules of conduct for Participants and Visitors;
  - e) the use of historical vehicles, blank-firing weapons, and pyrotechnic materials.
- 2.6 Failure to comply with the guidelines, instructions, procedures, or announcements referred to in Clause 2.4 may result in refusal of participation in the Event or part thereof, or an order to leave the Event Area.
- 2.7 Every person present within the Event Area is obliged to comply with the provisions of these Regulations.

### Section 3

- 3.1 Admission to the Event Area shall be free of charge.
- 3.2 The Organizer reserves the right to make changes to the course and program of the Event for important organizational, technical, or safety reasons, or in the event of force majeure, including without prior notice if prior notification is not possible.
- 3.3 Participants may include, in particular, members of formal and informal organizations, independent reenactors, owners of historical vehicles, invited guests, and media representatives. In other cases, the Organizer’s consent shall be required.
- 3.4 Conditions for participation in the Event for Participants:

- a) being at least 18 years of age, or, in the case of minors, possessing the consent of a parent or legal guardian to participate in the Event;
- b) possessing a uniform or civilian clothing compliant with the Organizer's guidelines concerning the representation of the historical realities of the World War II period (Normandy landings operation, 1944), exclusively in the case of participation in reenactment activities, including in particular historical vehicle parades;
- c) acceptance of these Regulations.

3.5 Visitors may remain exclusively within the Audience Zone.

3.6 Minors may remain within the Event Area only under the continuous supervision of a parent, legal guardian, or another adult authorized by the parent or legal guardian, who shall bear responsibility for their conduct and safety during their stay within the Event Area.

3.7 The Organizer may introduce additional activities as part of the Event, including in particular competitions, field games, demonstrations, or other forms of educational, promotional, or entertainment activities.

3.8 The rules governing participation in the individual activities referred to in paragraph 7 shall be specified in separate guidelines, instructions, procedures, or announcements issued by the Organizer in connection with the execution of the Event, constituting a clarification of these Regulations.

#### Section 4

4.1 It is prohibited to bring into the Event Area:

- a) weapons or other items deemed dangerous by the Organizer's Services for safety reasons;
- b) explosive materials and pyrotechnic products;
- c) flammable and fire-hazardous materials, including pressurized containers;
- d) laser pointers;
- e) flying devices, including but not limited to drones, remote-controlled models, gas (helium) balloons, sky lanterns, and other objects that may pose a threat to the safety of the Event;
- f) alcoholic beverages and beverages in plastic bottles that are not originally sealed;
- g) glass bottles, containers, and other glass packaging;
- h) narcotic drugs, psychotropic substances, or other similarly acting substances;

- i) tools and other objects that may pose a threat to the safety of persons present within the Event Area or to property.
- 4.2 The Organizer or the Organizer's Services shall be authorized to refuse the bringing into the Event Area of items which, in their assessment, may pose a threat to the safety of the Event, even if such items are not listed in paragraph 1.
- 4.3 The prohibition referred to in Clause 4.1 shall not apply to items and materials authorized by the Organizer as part of the implementation of the Event program, in particular those used during historical reenactments, under the rules specified by the Organizer, as well as items and materials used by the Organizer or the Organizer's Services for organizational, safety, rescue, or documentation purposes.
- 4.4 It is prohibited within the Event Area, in particular within the Show Zone and its immediate vicinity, to:
- a) use flying devices, including but not limited to drones, remote-controlled models, as well as gas (helium) balloons, sky lanterns, and other objects that may affect the safety of the Event;
  - b) use sound amplification or sound-emitting devices (in particular portable speakers, megaphones, and similar devices) in a manner disrupting the course of the Event or the comfort of other participants;
  - c) use open flames, light campfires, or use grills without the Organizer's consent.
- 4.5 It is prohibited to:
- a) approach historical vehicles while they are moving or in operation, as well as entering their immediate vicinity or parking area without the Organizer's consent;
  - b) bring dogs or other animals into the Event Area during the Show, except for assistance dogs accompanying persons with disabilities, in particular guide dogs. A person accompanied by an assistance dog should possess a certificate confirming the dog's status and a valid vaccination certificate;
  - c) conduct commercial trading, promotional or service activities, as well as charitable activities, within the Event Area without the prior written consent of the Organizer;
  - d) damage or destroy infrastructure or any equipment located within the Event Area.
- 4.6 The Organizer may refuse entry to the Event Area, refuse participation in the Event, or order the immediate removal of persons who:
- a) are visibly under the influence of alcohol, narcotic drugs, psychotropic substances, or other similarly acting substances;

- b) possess weapons, explosive materials, pyrotechnic products, fire-hazardous materials, narcotic drugs, psychotropic substances, or other items that may pose a threat to the life or health of persons or to property – excluding items authorized by the Organizer as part of the implementation of the Event program, in particular for the purposes of historical reenactment;
- c) behave aggressively, provocatively, or otherwise create a threat to the safety, order, or course of the Event;
- d) refuse to undergo inspection activities carried out by the Organizer's Services regarding authorization to remain within the Event Area or compliance with the Regulations;
- e) fail to comply with the instructions of the Organizer or the Organizer's Services, including security personnel and persons authorized by the Organizer, or violate the provisions of these Regulations;
- f) are minors remaining without the required supervision or care;
- g) grossly violate the provisions of these Regulations or the safety rules applicable within the Event Area.

The decisions referred to in this paragraph shall be made by the Organizer or a person authorized by the Organizer, in a manner proportionate to the threat involved.

- 4.7 Any attempt to bring in, or the bringing in, of prohibited items referred to in Clause 4.1, as well as violation of the rules specified in Clause 4.4 and 4.5, shall constitute a serious breach of the Regulations and may result in refusal of entry or removal from the Event.
- 4.8 All persons present within the Event Area are obliged to comply with the instructions of the Organizer, the Organizer's Services, including security personnel and event staff, as well as with all markings, barriers, and safety announcements.
- 4.9 Persons present within the Audience Zone are obliged to maintain a safe distance from historical reenactment zones and to comply with markings, barriers, and instructions issued by the Organizer's Services in accordance with announcements and markings applicable within the Event Area.
- 4.10 The provisions of this paragraph result from safety rules established by the Organizer and shall apply to all persons present within the Event Area.

## Section 5

- 5.1 The Organizer shall ensure order and safety during the Event through:

- a) the operation of the Organizer's Services, including security personnel and event staff, appropriately uniformed and identified;
  - b) providing medical assistance and sanitary and hygiene facilities.
- 5.2 The Organizer is entitled to record the course of the Event using devices for recording image and sound for documentary, informational, and promotional purposes of the Event. The image of persons present within the Event Area may be recorded and disseminated for the above purposes, in accordance with applicable law.
- 5.3 Without prior consent of the Organizer, the use of motor vehicles, bicycles, scooters, or similar means of transport is prohibited throughout the Event Area, with the exception of vehicles used for historical reenactment purposes and vehicles of the Organizer's Services, including security personnel and event staff, holding appropriate Identification Badges.
- 5.4 The Organizer shall designate and ensure the marking of zones dividing the Event Area into areas accessible to persons participating in the Event, including:
- a) the Audience Zone – areas within a designated part of the Event Area accessible to Visitors, where no Identification Badge is required;
  - b) Special Zones – areas within a designated part of the Event Area accessible exclusively to Participants upon presentation of appropriate Identification Badges.
- 5.5 Staying within selected Special Zones, in particular the historical reenactment zone and areas involving pyrotechnic effects, may involve an increased risk of accidents due to the nature of the activities conducted, which the Participant acknowledges and accepts by participating in the Event.
- 5.6 The Organizer may designate additional restricted-access areas within Special Zones, in accordance with the nature and organizational needs of the Event.
- 5.7 The Organizer reserves the right to temporarily or permanently close selected Special Zones and restrict access to them for safety, organizational, operational, technical, weather-related reasons, or reasons connected with the execution of the Event, without any right of claims by Participants in this respect.
- 5.8 The Organizer does not provide parking areas for Visitors within the Event Area.
- 5.9 The Organizer shall supervise safety in the Audience Zone to an extent appropriate to its open nature.
- 5.10 The Organizer shall ensure fire safety measures by:
- a) ensuring that staff and the Organizer are familiar with the location of portable firefighting equipment and know the procedures in the event of fire;

- b) ensuring that the Organizer's Services, including security personnel and event staff, are trained in evacuation procedures, methods of alerting the fire brigade, use of portable firefighting equipment, and first aid.

5.11 Participation in the Event is at the sole risk of persons participating in the Event, within the scope of risks typical for outdoor events, in particular those associated with large crowds and the nature of historical reenactments, including the use of pyrotechnic and sound effects, blank-firing weapons, and historical vehicles, subject to applicable law, in particular regarding the Organizer's liability for damages caused by intentional fault or gross negligence.

5.12 The Organizer shall not be liable for loss, destruction, damage, or theft of personal belongings of persons participating in the Event, including in particular clothing, photographic equipment, electronic devices, luggage, and other items brought into the Event Area, unless the damage was caused by the Organizer's intentional fault or gross negligence.

5.13 Personal belongings brought into the Event Area remain under the sole responsibility of their owners. The Organizer does not provide storage or deposit facilities. The Organizer recommends not bringing items of high value.

5.14 The Organizer reserves the right to temporarily suspend or interrupt the Event in the event of a threat to life or health of persons participating in the Event, in particular due to weather conditions, fire risk, or security incidents. The decision shall be made by the Organizer or a person designated by the Organizer.

5.15 In the event of an evacuation announcement, Participants are obliged to immediately leave the Event Area in accordance with the instructions of the Organizer's Services and evacuation markings. Failure to comply with instructions may result in the application of security measures and notification of relevant public authorities.

## Section 6

6.1 The Organizer's Services are divided into:

- a) security personnel – responsible for safety and order;
- b) event staff – responsible for informational and organizational activities, performing their duties upon instructions from the Organizer or persons designated by the Organizer.

6.2 Security personnel, wearing an identification badge displayed in a visible manner, are entitled to:

- a) verify the right to remain within designated zones of the Event Area;

- b) enforce the prohibition on bringing in prohibited items;
- c) issue order instructions to persons disrupting public order or behaving in violation of the Event Regulations, and in the event of failure to comply with such instructions – order them to leave the Event Area.

Security personnel perform their duties in accordance with applicable law, in particular in the area of protection of persons and property. Actions taken by security personnel shall be appropriate to the situation and proportionate to the threat.

6.3 Event staff, wearing safety vests and identified by a badge displayed in a visible place, are obliged to:

- a) provide organizational, safety, and informational instructions;
- b) indicate the location of zones, medical points, and sanitary facilities;
- c) direct the movement of persons and inform about prohibited access to areas not designated for the public;
- d) immediately respond to incidents and threats and take necessary remedial actions, in particular by informing the Organizer;
- e) monitor all areas of potential risk and prevent excessive crowding;
- f) ensure compliance with the provisions of the Event Regulations;
- g) respond in an informational manner to questions and reports from Event participants.

Event staff are not authorized to use coercive measures or undertake interventions beyond informational, order-maintaining, and organizational activities.

6.4 In the event of a threat to public order or the safety of persons, where the actions of the Organizer's Services are insufficient, the Organizer may request assistance from relevant public services, in particular the Police.

6.5 If the Organizer's Services determine that persons are present within the Event Area without a valid Identification Badge or other document authorizing their presence, such persons may be ordered to leave the Event Area, and in case of non-compliance – may be removed by security personnel.

6.6 The absence of a valid Identification Badge or its revocation shall result in the immediate obligation to leave the zone to which access was granted by such badge.

6.7 In the event of loss, damage, or withdrawal of an Identification Badge, the Organizer may deny access to the relevant zone until the Participant's authorization has been clarified. Decisions in this regard shall be made by the Organizer's Services.

## Section 7

- 7.1 The owner or user of a historical vehicle is obliged to ensure its safe operation and to exercise particular care during participation in the Event. They shall be responsible for the technical condition of the vehicle and its proper use by persons authorized by them, within the scope resulting from applicable law and safety rules in force during the Event.
- 7.2 A vehicle participating in the Event must meet the following conditions:
- a) possess a valid third-party liability insurance (OC) policy;
  - b) move and remain exclusively in areas of the Event Area designated by the Organizer;
  - c) be used solely in accordance with its intended purpose and in compliance with safety rules specified by the Organizer and applicable law.
- 7.3 It is prohibited to:
- a) organize rides or dynamic maneuvers involving the public;
  - b) perform sudden acceleration or braking in a manner that may pose a risk to third parties;
  - c) operate vehicles at excessive speed within the Event Area;
  - d) make a vehicle available to persons who do not possess the required authorizations;
  - e) operate a vehicle under the influence of alcohol, narcotic drugs, or other substances impairing driving ability;
  - f) leave running vehicles unattended by an authorized person.
- 7.4 The vehicle owner is obliged to ensure the possibility of its removal (including towing) in the event of breakdown or technical necessity.
- 7.5 The Organizer shall not be liable for damages resulting from improper operation of vehicles by Participants, unless caused by the Organizer's intentional fault or gross negligence.

## Section 8

- 8.1 Without the Organizer's consent, it is prohibited to:
- a) store pyrotechnic materials and fuels;
  - b) refuel vehicles;
  - c) light bonfires;
  - d) carry out earthworks.
- 8.2 Participants are obliged to behave in accordance with the principles of social coexistence and to maintain order within the Event Area.

- 8.3 Participants bear full responsibility for the equipment, gear, and weapon replicas in their possession.
- 8.4 The Participant acknowledges that historical reenactment is an activity with an elevated level of risk, in particular due to the use of historical vehicles, blank-firing weapons, pyrotechnic effects, and increased noise levels.
- 8.5 The Participant shall bear material and legal responsibility for any damage caused by them to other Participants, third parties, or property located within the Event Area.
- 8.6 Participant acknowledge that noise levels during the Show may be significantly elevated due to the reenactment nature of the Event.
- 8.7 It is prohibited to consume alcohol or to be under the influence of alcohol or narcotic substances during participation in the Show and other program activities, as well as during reenactment activities.
- 8.8 The Organizer has the right to exclude a Participant from participation in the Event in the case of a material breach of the Regulations or safety rules, in particular in situations posing a threat to life, health, or property, after prior warning, if the nature of the situation allows it.

## Section 9

- 9.1 The provisions of this paragraph apply exclusively to Participants authorized to take part in the Show and other reenactment activities.
- 9.2 The use of weapons, blank ammunition, and pyrotechnic materials shall take place exclusively in locations and at times designated by the Organizer and under the supervision of persons authorized by the Organizer.
- 9.3 The security and supervision of blank-firing weapons used during the Event shall be carried out by a specialized external company designated by the Organizer.
- 9.4 Blank-firing weapons shall be issued exclusively to adults upon presentation of an identity document.
- 9.5 Weapons shall be issued based on a list prepared by the Organizer.
- 9.6 Possession of privately owned blank-firing weapons by a Participant requires prior notification to the Organizer, no later than on the day of arrival. A person possessing a weapon must hold all required permits confirming the legality of its possession and use.
- 9.7 Weapons used during the Show may be collected exclusively at the location and time designated by the Organizer and only by adults holding a valid identity document.

- 9.8 A weapon shall not be issued in the case of reasonable suspicion that the Participant is under the influence of or has consumed alcohol or narcotic substances.
- 9.9 From the moment of collection until return, the Participant bears legal and material responsibility for the weapon, to the extent permitted by law, including its proper use and safeguarding.
- 9.10 Ammunition shall be issued together with the blank-firing weapon, in an amount appropriate to the weapon.
- 9.11 It is prohibited to use blank ammunition other than that issued together with the weapon.
- 9.12 Any unused ammunition must be returned by the Participant together with the issued blank-firing weapon.
- 9.13 Blank-firing weapons may be used exclusively within the Show Area.
- 9.14 It is prohibited to:
- a) move with blank-firing weapons outside the Show Area;
  - b) fire in the direction of spectators of the Show or other persons who are not Participants;
  - c) fire in the direction of animals present within the Event Area;
  - d) lend, even temporarily, a collected weapon to third parties;
  - e) fire shots at a distance that may endanger the health or life of other Participants;
  - f) leave blank-firing weapons unattended.
- 9.15 In case of any doubts regarding the safe use of weapons or ammunition, the Participant is obliged to report them to the Organizer or to the instructor responsible for issuing weapons.
- 9.16 The security and handling of pyrotechnic materials shall be carried out by persons designated by the Organizer who hold appropriate qualifications.
- 9.17 The use of pyrotechnic materials is permitted exclusively in locations indicated by the Organizer and in agreement with the person responsible for pyrotechnic effects.
- 9.18 During the preparation and placement of pyrotechnic materials, persons present within the Show Area are obliged to strictly follow the instructions of those responsible for pyrotechnic effects.
- 9.19 The person responsible for pyrotechnic effects is authorized to suspend, interrupt, or terminate the pyrotechnic display in the event of a threat to life, health, or property, or in case of violation of safety rules regarding the execution of pyrotechnic effects.

9.20 The Organizer is authorized to suspend, interrupt, or terminate the Show, including the pyrotechnic display, in the event of a threat to life, health, or property, or in case of violation of safety rules.

9.21 It is prohibited to:

- a) bring into or use within the Show Area any personal pyrotechnic devices, regardless of their size or explosive power;
- b) independently alter the arrangement, arming, or disarming of pyrotechnic materials, or interfere with the activities of persons responsible for pyrotechnic effects; or violate designated pyrotechnic zones – such behavior may result in exclusion from the Show or its interruption in extreme situations.

9.22 Violation of safety rules concerning weapons and pyrotechnic materials shall result in the Participant's material and legal liability and may lead to exclusion from participation in the Event as well as interruption of the Show.

## Section 10

10.1 The Event is of an exclusively historical, educational and re-enactment character. Its purpose is to recreate historical events in a manner consistent with historical accuracy, without promoting any political ideologies, in particular totalitarian ideologies.

10.2 Within the Event Area and in connection with participation in the Event, it is prohibited to:

- a) promote, publicly present or disseminate any ideology of National Socialism, Communism, or any other totalitarian ideology;
- b) engage in actions, behaviours, gestures, statements, or display of symbols that may constitute promotion, endorsement, or justification of such ideologies;
- c) use symbolism, uniforms, insignia or props in a manner inconsistent with the educational, historical and re-enactment purposes of the Event.

10.3 Historical elements, including uniforms, insignia, symbols and props, may be used exclusively within the scope of the Event, to the extent necessary for the implementation of its programme, subject to prior consent of the Organizer and under its supervision, provided that such use does not lead to the promotion of any ideologies referred to in Clause 10.2.

10.4 Outside the Event Area, it is prohibited to use uniforms, insignia or symbols associated with totalitarian formations and organisations, in particular those from the period of the Second World War, in any manner that may violate applicable law or the personal rights of third parties.

10.5 Participation in the Event within re-enactment groups portraying historical formations is permitted exclusively for adults. In the case of minors, participation is allowed only under the supervision of an adult, who shall confirm in writing that they have read and accepted the Regulations and who assumes responsibility for supervising the minor.

10.6 The provisions of this section are applied in connection with compliance with generally applicable law, in particular Article 256 of the Act of 6 June 1997 – Penal Code (Journal of Laws 1997 No. 88, item 553, as amended), and in order to ensure compliance of the Event with public order and safety principles.

## Section 11

11.1 The Controller of personal data is the Organizer, i.e. the Foundation for the Protection of Military Technical Heritage, with its registered office in Bielsko-Biała at ul. Pasterska 18.

11.2 The personal data of Event Participants are processed for the purpose of organizing and conducting the Event, in particular for handling registrations, organizational contact, allocation of identification badges, ensuring safety, and fulfilling legal obligations incumbent on the Organizer.

11.3 Personal data are processed on the following legal bases:

- a) Article 6(1)(b) GDPR – to the extent necessary for participation in the Event;
- b) Article 6(1)(c) GDPR – for compliance with legal obligations incumbent on the Organizer;
- c) Article 6(1)(f) GDPR – for the purposes of the legitimate interests pursued by the Organizer, consisting of organizing the Event, ensuring safety, and establishing, exercising or defending legal claims;
- d) Article 6(1)(a) GDPR – for data processed on the basis of consent, in particular the publication of image in promotional materials.

11.4 Detailed information regarding the processing of personal data, including the retention period and the rights of data subjects, is provided to Participants in the information clause during the registration process and made available in application forms.

11.5 The image of persons present in the Event Area may be recorded in connection with the Event. The image may be processed by the Organizer for documentation, informational, promotional, marketing, and archival purposes, in particular through publication in the Organizer's materials, on the Event website, in social media, and in press materials, on the following legal bases:

- a) Article 6(1)(f) GDPR – for documenting and reporting the course of the Event;
- b) Article 6(1)(a) GDPR – for the publication of image for promotional purposes, where separate consent is required.

11.6 The processing of images of visitors (general public) takes place as part of reporting the Event and may include their presence in the public space of the Event Area, in compliance with applicable laws.

11.7 Personal data may be disclosed to entities authorized under applicable law and to entities cooperating with the Organizer in the organization of the Event, solely to the extent necessary for its implementation.

## Section 12

12.1 In matters not regulated by the Regulations, the provisions of the Civil Code and the laws applicable in the territory of the Republic of Poland shall apply.

12.2 The Regulations shall enter into force on the date of their announcement and shall remain in force until the official conclusion of the Event by the Organizer.

12.3 Entry to the Event Area and participation in the Event shall constitute acknowledgement of this Regulation, acceptance of its provisions, and an obligation to comply with it by all persons present in the Event Area.

12.4 The Organizer reserves the right to amend the Regulation in justified cases (including but not limited to safety concerns, errors or omissions, changes in law, or other unforeseen circumstances), by publishing information about such changes on the Event website at: [www.d-dayhel.pl](http://www.d-dayhel.pl). Material changes affecting safety or the organization of the Event may also be introduced during the Event and communicated to participants via announcements issued by the Organizer, information points, or the Event website.
